

Remember...try a new program, attend a new event and be active in your community!



PARK POLICIES

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- Children must be the correct age by 9/1/21, unless otherwise specified. In order to provide your child with the best possible recreational and/or learning experience, all of our programs are planned according to the ages listed in our Program Guide.
- Although your child may turn the correct age during the session of a program, our age requirement date coincides with the school district's date to assist with the fundamental growth of the child in the age-appropriate programs and therefore would not be eligible for registration.
- Classes are for the registered child only, except for classes with an adult. Parents should not remain in the classroom or gymnasium after dropping off their child. This is in the child's best interest, as continual interruptions tend to affect participants' attention span and inhibit the establishment of peer relationships.
- All children must be potty-trained unless they are attending a class where an adult stays with them or is otherwise stated in the class description. Diapers are not permitted in independent classes unless stated in the class description.
- Please do not bring food to any class unless previously arranged.
- For your child's safety, all children enrolled in programs must be picked up from the specific door by their parent(s) or designated guardian. No child will be released from the building to anyone other than these individuals.
- A mandatory sign-in and sign-out procedure for all participants is required for all Park District Programs. Children must be accompanied by an adult when escorted to the door.

REFUND POLICY

No refunds are given: (1) once a program begins unless a replacement is found; (2) on material fees unless we cancel a program; (3) on bus trips; or (4) for special events or one-day programs. A full refund is issued if we cancel a program or trip.

- When a participant cancels out of a program, a full refund, less a \$5 service charge (per program), will be granted. A \$5 service charge will also be assessed on all program transfers. These requests will only be honored if the request is submitted three business days prior to the start of the program or activity.
- All refunds less than \$10 will be applied as a credit to the customer's account.
- Every effort will be made to process refunds within 30 days, but in some instances it may take longer.
- New Lenox Community Park District reserves the right to change program details at any time.

CANCELLATIONS

Staff reserves the right to consolidate, postpone, reschedule or cancel any program due to changes in day, dates, times, instructor or insufficient enrollment. If program enrollment does not meet the minimum number of registrants, we try to cancel the program seven days prior to the start date or by the registration deadline.

For cancellations due to unforeseen circumstances (i.e., inclement weather, facility emergencies or scheduling conflicts), which are announced by Lincoln-Way District 210 or New Lenox School District 122 at facilities where Park District programs are scheduled, Park District programming will be cancelled as well. All attempts will be made to reschedule cancelled classes. However, the New Lenox Community Park District is sometimes unable to accommodate make-up classes and will not refund money in such instances.

PROGRAM BEHAVIOR POLICY

Participants are expected to exhibit appropriate behavior at all times. The following guidelines have been developed to help make Park District programs safe and enjoyable for all participants. Additional rules may be developed for particular programs and athletic leagues as deemed necessary by staff.

- Show respect to participants and staff and take direction from staff.
- Refrain from using abusive or foul language or from causing bodily harm to self, other participants or staff.
- Show respect to equipment, supplies and facilities. The New Lenox Community Park District reserves the right to terminate a party's participation in a Park District program due to that party's disruptive behavior or conduct.

PHOTO DISCLAIMER

Registrants and participants permit to the taking of photos and videos of themselves and their children during Park District activities for publication and use as the Park District deems necessary.

PROGRAM GUIDE DISTRIBUTION

To provide you the most up-to-date information, the Program Guides will be available online only at newlenoxparks.org. We continue to review guidelines to determine the best way to safely serve the community while fulfilling our mission of providing quality community life.

LIABILITY

The New Lenox Community Park District is unable to assume responsibility for injuries, accidents or loss of personal property occurring during programs or activities, in parks or facilities. Such insurance would make programs and user fees prohibitive.

AMERICAN DISABILITIES ACT (ADA)

A request for ADA modifications or assistance at a program is required at the time of registration.

Please mark the ADA box on the Registration Form and call our Administration Building at (815) 485-3584. Early registration, along with a request for accommodation, is strongly suggested to assure that appropriate modifications are secured prior to the start of the program. We recommend at least two weeks' notice to have modifications in place.



REGISTRATION POLICIES

- A government issued birth certificate is required for all participants five (5) years and younger before registration will be accepted.
- Parents/guardians may register for immediate family members only. Each adult must sign the Registration Form.
- Phone-in registrations are not accepted.
- If there is a problem with your registration, we will try to contact you by phone or email. If we cannot reach you, the Registration Form will be returned to the sender, thereby jeopardizing registration and program placement. Be sure to include a valid primary contact phone number on all Registration Forms.
- Registration is not complete until a printed confirmation or email receipt has been issued.
- The New Lenox Community Park District is not responsible for lost or late mail or faxes.
- All Registration Forms must be signed. Those without signatures will be returned to the sender, thereby jeopardizing registration and program placement.
- A \$25 service charge will be assessed on all rejected credit card payments for families utilizing our Automatic Payment Plan and \$30 service charge on all returned checks.
- The New Lenox Community Park District reserves the right to suspend participation in activities of customers whose account is in "bad standing" until all fees are paid. Failure to pay may result in collection costs added to outstanding balances.

RESIDENT REGISTRATION (R)

Resident Registration and Online Registration will begin on **Monday**, **August 9 at 9:00am** at the Administration Building, 701 W. Haven Avenue.

Registration Forms are accepted as soon as our Program Guide is posted on our website, but will not be processed until Monday, August 9 at 9:00am. Early submission of registration does not guarantee enrollment in a program.

NONRESIDENT REGISTRATION (NR)

Nonresident participants can register for New Lenox Community Park District programs beginning **Monday**, **August 16**. Additional fees for nonresidents may apply. We do not charge a nonresident fee for special events or bus trips.

REGISTRATION INFO

FIRST-TIME REGISTRATION

When registering for the first time, residents will need to provide proof of residency by showing proper documentation. Those documents include:

One Item from Category 1

- Most recent property tax bill
- Most recent mortgage statement (we do not accept mortgage coupon payment books)
- Signed and dated lease or letter from manager (on letterhead) and proof of last month's payment
- Mortgage closing statement (if you have moved in the last 30 days)

Two Items from Category 2

- Valid Illinois Driver's License or State I.D. Card
- Most recent gas, electric and/or water bill
- Most recent cable television bill, credit card bill and/or bank statement
- Voter Registration
- Vehicle Registration
- Current Public Aid Card

Nonresidents will need to provide a valid Driver's License or State I.D. Card at the time of registration.

PAYMENT

- Full payment must be paid to the New Lenox Community Park District at time of registration
- Cash, credit/debit cards or checks are acceptable forms of payment
- Checks should be made payable to New Lenox Community Park District or NLCPD
- We do not accept payments over the phone

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

If you are (1) a New Lenox Community Park District resident and (2) cannot participate for financial reasons, you may be eligible for financial aid. Please contact the Park District's Deputy Director of Recreation at (815) 485-3584 for an interview. Please note that the maximum household scholarship benefit is \$1,000 per calendar year.

Adult

This eight-week program is an evidence-based, multiple component exercise program. 



What does Kiddie Kampus offer its participants?

The New Lenox Community Park District offers preschool classes designed to develop social, emotional and physical skills to ensure school readiness. A child's separation from parents and involvement with a non-family member is one of many major steps towards his/her development. Kiddie Kampus provides a safe and supportive environment for your child's first school experience while increasing his/her self-esteem and confidence through ageappropriate instruction. Covered during the year are color, shape and number recognition, an introduction to number concepts and letter recognition. Your child's quest for learning will be nurtured through creative play, building friendships, working individually and cooperating as part of a group. These activities promote patience, sharing and the awareness that there is a whole world of people surrounding and supporting them. Songs, stories, activities and games are used for reinforcement and fun.

What requirements are necessary for Kiddie Kampus registration?

- A copy of your child's birth certificate MUST be provided at registration. A child must be four (three for the 3-year-old program), on or before September 1, 2021, and must be able to handle bathroom hygiene independently (potty-trained, no diapers). It is very helpful if the child can zip/button independently.
- 2. A \$50 non-refundable registration fee, first month's tuition, along with a T-shirt fee of \$10 (if needed) will be collected when registering your child. The remainder of the fees are then divided into eight equal monthly payments. All payments are due on the 15th of the month, beginning September 15. A late fee of \$25 will be assessed to any account that is delinquent.
- 3. You must sign up for our automatic payment plan, exception is if you pay in full. You must complete these forms and submit them at the time of registration.
- 4. If you pay your full tuition payment at time of registration, the \$50 non-refundable registration fee will be waived.
- 5. A voter's card or tax bill is required at registration for verification of residency.




