

Reminder to Pet Owners

When visiting local parks with your pet, please remember that the Park District and Village ordinances require dogs to be leashed at all times. Owners are responsible for cleaning up any animal excrement from public property.

What is the S.T.O.P. PROGRAM?

S.T.O.P. stands for Stop Trashing Our Parks and is represented by our mascot, Bucky the Beaver. Bucky's mission is to keep our parks safe and free of vandalism. To help support Bucky's mission, cash rewards will be paid for S.T.O.P information leading to the apprehension of park vandals (individuals providing information are not required to identify themselves). Hopefully, kids of all ages can relate to our friendly mascot and his mission.

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PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- Children must be the correct age by 9/1/24, unless otherwise specified. In order to provide your child with the best possible recreational and/or learning experience, all our programs are planned according to the ages listed in our Program Guide.
- Children must meet the age requirements of a class. The Recreation Department reserves the right to request a birth certificate if the age of the child is in question. If a child is not the appropriate age for a class, he/she will be dropped from the program.
- Classes are for the registered child only, except for classes with an adult. Parents will drop child off at the designated location, you will not be able to remain in the classroom, gymnasium or the Lions Community Center. This is in the child's best interest, as continual interruptions tend to affect participants' attention span and inhibit the establishment of peer relationships.
- All children must be potty-trained unless they are attending a class
 where an adult stays with them or is otherwise stated in the class
 description. Diapers are not permitted in independent classes unless
 stated in the class description.
- Please do not bring food to any class unless previously arranged.
- For your child's safety, all children enrolled in programs must be
 picked up from the specific classroom or program site by their
 parent(s) or designated guardian. No child will be released from the
 classroom to anyone other than individuals from the pick-up list.
- A mandatory sign-in and sign-out procedure for all participants is required for all Park District Programs. Children must be accompanied by an adult when escorted to and from class.

REFUND POLICY

No refunds are given: (1) once a program begins unless a replacement is found; (2) on material fees unless we cancel a program; (3) on bus trips; or (4) for special events or one-day programs. A full refund is issued if we cancel a program or trip.

- When a participant cancels out of a program, a full refund, less a \$5 service charge (per program), will be granted. A \$5 service charge will also be assessed on all program transfers.
- These requests will only be honored if the request is submitted three business days prior to the start of the program or activity.
- All refunds less than \$10 will be applied as a credit to the customer's account.
- Every effort will be made to process refunds within 30 days, but in some instances it may take longer.
- New Lenox Community Park District reserves the right to change program details at any time.

CANCELLATIONS

Staff reserves the right to consolidate, postpone, reschedule, or cancel any program due to changes in day, dates, times, instructor or insufficient enrollment. If program enrollment does not meet the minimum number of registrants, we try to cancel the program seven days prior to the start date or by the registration deadline.

For cancellations due to unforeseen circumstances (i.e., inclement weather, facility emergencies or scheduling conflicts), which are announced by Lincoln-Way District 210 or New Lenox School District 122 at facilities where Park District programs are scheduled, Park District programming will be cancelled as well. All attempts will be made to reschedule cancelled classes. However, the New Lenox Community Park District is sometimes unable to accommodate make-up classes and will not refund money in such instances.

PROGRAM BEHAVIOR POLICY

Participants are expected to exhibit appropriate behavior. The following guidelines have been developed to help make Park District programs safe and enjoyable for all participants. Additional rules may be developed for programs and athletic leagues as deemed necessary by staff.

- Show respect to participants and staff and take direction from staff.
- Refrain from using abusive or foul language or from causing bodily harm to self, other participants or staff.
- Show respect to equipment, supplies and facilities. The New Lenox Community Park District reserves the right to terminate a party's participation in a Park District program due to that party's disruptive behavior or conduct.

To provide you the most up-to-date information, the Program Guides will be available online only at newlenoxparks.org. We continue to review guidelines to determine the best way to safely serve the community while fulfilling our mission of providing quality community life.

Registrants and participants permit to the taking of photos and videos of themselves and their children during Park District activities for publication and use as the Park District deems necessary.

LIABILITY

The New Lenox Community Park District is unable to assume responsibility for injuries, accidents or loss of personal property occurring during programs or activities, in parks or facilities. Such insurance would make programs and user fees prohibitive.

AMERICAN DISABILITIES ACT (ADA)

A request for ADA modifications or assistance at a program is required at the time of registration. Please mark the ADA box on the Registration Form and call our Administration Building at (815) 485-3584. Early registration, along with a request for accommodation, is strongly suggested to assure that appropriate modifications are secured prior to the start of the program. We recommend at least four weeks' notice to have modifications in place.

REGISTRATION POLICIES

- · A government issued birth certificate is required for all participants two (2) years and younger before registration will be accepted.
- Parents/guardians may register for immediate family members only. Each adult must sign the Registration
- Phone-in registrations are not accepted.
- If there is a problem with your registration, we will contact you by phone or email. If we cannot reach you, the Registration Form will be returned by mail and your place in the program cannot be saved. Be sure to include a valid daytime phone number and e-mail on all Registration Forms.
- Registration is not complete until a printed confirmation or email receipt has been issued.
- The New Lenox Community Park District is not responsible for lost or late mail or faxes.
- All Registration Forms must be signed. Those without signatures will be returned to the sender, thereby jeopardizing registration and program placement.
- A \$25 service charge will be assessed on all rejected credit card payments for families utilizing our installment billing system and \$30 service charge on all returned checks.
- The New Lenox Community Park District reserves the right to suspend participation in activities of customers whose account is in "bad standing" until all fees are paid. Failure to pay may result in collection costs added to outstanding balances.

RESIDENT REGISTRATION (R)

Resident Registration and Online Registration will begin on Monday, May 6, at 8:30am at the Administration Building, 701 W. Haven Avenue.

Registration Forms are accepted as soon as our Program Guide is posted on our website, but will not be processed until Monday, May 6, at 8:30am. Early submission of registration does not guarantee enrollment in a program.

NONRESIDENT REGISTRATION (NR)

Nonresident participants can register for New Lenox Community Park District programs beginning Monday, May 13. Additional fees for nonresidents may apply. We do not charge a nonresident fee for special events or bus trips.

REGISTRATION INFO

FIRST-TIME REGISTRATION

When registering for the first time, residents will need to provide proof of residency by showing proper documentation. Those documents include:

One Item from Category 1

- Most recent property tax bill
- Most recent mortgage statement (we do not accept mortgage coupon payment books)
- Signed and dated lease or letter from manager (on letterhead) and proof of last month's payment
- Mortgage closing statement (if you have moved in the last 30 days)

Two Items from Category 2

- Valid Illinois Driver's License or State I.D. Card
- Most recent gas, electric and/or water bill
- Most recent cable television bill, credit card bill and/or bank statement
- Voter Registration
- Vehicle Registration
- Current Public Aid Card

Nonresidents will need to provide a valid Driver's License or State I.D. Card at the time of registration.

PAYMENT

- Full payment must be paid to the New Lenox Community Park District at time of registration
- Cash, credit/debit cards or checks are acceptable forms of payment
- Checks should be made payable to New Lenox Community Park District or NLCPD
- We do not accept payments over the phone

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

If you are a New Lenox resident and cannot participate for financial reasons, you may be eligible for financial aid. Please e-mail completed Financial Aid Application and supporting documentation to Olga Viano at oviano@newlenoxparks.org. Forms are located on our website under district information. All required documentation must be submitted with the completed application two weeks prior to the start of the program. Please note that the maximum household scholarship benefit is \$1,000 per year.

MILITARY DISCOUNT

We are pleased to offer a military discount for those who qualify. A Military Master Form must be filled out completely prior to receiving the military discount. For more information, please visit newlenoxparks.org/registration/.







In order to be approved to bring in an inflatable (no water inflatables allowed; for a full list of prohibited items please visit newlenoxparks.org) onto Park District property; you MUST supply a Certificate of Insurance (COI) by Operating Vendor with a \$1,000,000.00 policy; naming the New Lenox Community Park District as additional insured with 701 W. Haven Avenue, New Lenox, IL 60451 as the address and include a copy of the vendor's permit to conduct business. Once the COI and Business Permit is received the renter will be allowed to have the inflatable on Park District property; this MUST be supplied prior to your event. These documents may be mailed to the Park District address above or faxed to (815) 485-3589 with ATTN: Park Rentals.

- Park Rentals are available from Apr. 15-Oct. 31
- Hours of Operation: 9:00am-8:00pm
- · All parks are ADA accessible
- *A security deposit of \$250 and rental fee is required for all Park Shelter Rentals at time of reservation.

Cancellation policy within the 14-day period prior to the rental date:

- 8-14 days prior: Security deposit is retained. The rest will be refunded within a period of 30 days.
- 7 days or less: Security deposit plus 50% of the rental fees will be retained. The other 50% will be refunded to the signee within a period of 30 days.
